Here is a hole for a bunny (*make circle with finger and thumb; make bunny ears with fingers on other hand*)

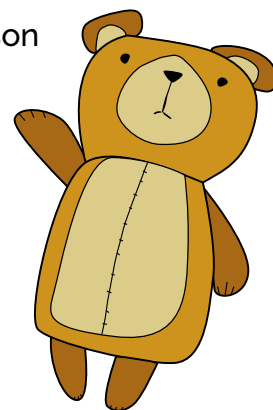
And here is a house for me (*tent hands together overhead to make a roof*)

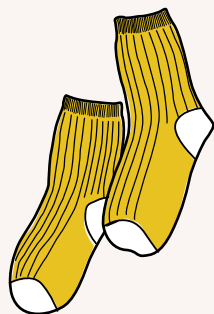
